

Minutes of the Regional Annual General Assembly (RAGA)

1. Preliminary Matters

1.1. *Opening, Welcome Address and Organization Matters*

The Voting Bureau closes and Johann Oberson opens the RAGA. He welcomes the Assembly. The president then addresses organizational matters and recalls that the RAGA is detailed in the online RAGA Package, the outline of which will be followed throughout the RAGA. He invites the Assembly to refer to it whenever necessary by scanning the code on the screen.

Daniel Aellen Treasurer Report:

Anticipating the impact of the 2022 COVID situation, it was foreseen that SwissCham's financial standing would be affected, particularly in light of the postponed SSEF. The numerous small-scale events held during this period, while contributing to revenue, were not financially significant. The primary source of income, derived from substantial events, has been deferred due to the prevailing circumstances.

The membership subscriptions, constituting a substantial portion of SwissCham's revenue, played a crucial role in offsetting the losses incurred from the deferred events. Currently, SwissCham's cash flow stands at 1.3 million, slightly below the 1.5 million required for the chamber's operational needs, including event expenses and general operations.

Revenues: CNY1,413K
Cost: CNY1,411K
- **2022 Actual Profit: CNY -492K,**
Revenues: CNY1078K
Cost: CNY1,570K

Moving forward, strategies will be devised to recover from the setbacks through adjustments in the upcoming budget. The account details highlight the pronounced impact of the SSEF postponement. The decision to separate costs and revenue aims to enhance transparency in financial reporting.

Reviewing the past year's accounts and projecting the upcoming year's budget, SwissCham acknowledges the challenges faced. Despite a loss of 493k in 2022, the budget allocates 272k to compensate for the previous year's shortfall. The increase in the number of events scheduled for this year is expected to boost revenue and rectify the financial situation.

Wages and Salary: 1151;
Event Cost: CNY1,110K;
G&A Cost: CNY322K

The above actual cost total was **higher in compare with 2022** cost of CNY1,570K

The surge in sponsorship requests may lead to a decrease in sponsors for SwissCham's flagship events. However, this marks the initiation of the positive trend to restore their cash flow. The return on investment for the current year is projected to be higher, with two flagship events budgeted for profitability.

It is essential for SwissCham to recompose the cash flow. The focus remains on achieving financial stability and sustaining SwissCham's operations.

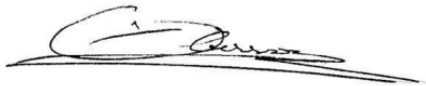

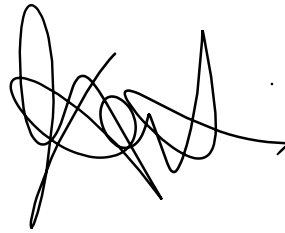
6. Appreciations & Closing
